- 1. Some students (about 10 to 15% of the total enrolled students appear in the exam next year.
- 2. Some of the students belonging to science departments, though being registered in our college, take admission to other courses like Engineering, Medical, vocational etc. due to late counselling by various Entrance Board.
- 3. Some, though a few in number are transfer to other colleges
- 4. As this is a girls' college, some candidates discontinue their studies because of marriage.
- 5. In fact it is not possible to keep the exact records of the above mention facts except fact number one.

There is no such coaching cell in the institution but the teachers of the respective departments advise the students about the preparation of competitive examination.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

2016-17 had been a year when the college gradually adapting to the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). However, the old system of annual assessment for the 2nd and 3rd year students annual tests were held for the general courses while unit tests were conducted for the honours subjects, there being continuous evaluation in the form of class tests, viva-voce, departmental seminars and so forth. As for the first batch introduced to CBCS system apart from the internal assessments as proposed by KNU, they were also subjected to rigours evaluation throughout the semester.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Most of the faculty members are actively engaged in Research and Development, seven of them were pursuing their Ph.D. while three were awarded their doctoral degree. Some of the research findings of our faculty members have also been published in renowned journals, totalling to nine. This period also witnessed to our teachers publishing books authored by them.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

With the introduction of CBCS system, new books were procured as per as the requirements of the new syllabus and added to the existing collection of the library. Two smart classrooms have been added with ICT instruments in this year.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Interdisciplinary classes are undertaken for development of the students. Resource mobilization for the welfare of the students is also undertaken. Apart from these, the college arranges for regular counselling to students, non-teaching staff and teachers. The college has NSS and NCC units. In order to foster a sense of empathy among the students a seven day NSS camp was held on March, 2017.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of teaching faculty in college is done through the Government Agency i.e. West Bengal College Service Commission (WBCSC). In the period of 2016-17, a total of fifteen (15) teachers joined the college in different departments being recommended by WBCSC. Secondly, recruitment is also done through a Board set up by the college which also has experts appointed through the university. The said Board arrange for interviews of Contractual Whole Time Teachers, Part Time Teachers and non-teaching staff and guest teachers. The said board is headed by the head of the institution, members of the Governing Body and concerned expert. Thirdly, notice for application for the above posts is made in news papers, college website and notice board. Written or viva-voce tests are often arranged for the same. Fourthly, after retirement of a teaching or non-teaching staff requisition in proper format is submitted for the vacant posts to the WBCSC.
